Ukrainian Ethnic Population in Canada

Based on Statistics Canada 2011 Census of National Household Survey

Highlights

- Edmonton continues to have the largest Ukrainian population of 148,160 (11.8% of the Ukrainian population in Canada), which increased by 2.5% and represents 12.8% of the population of Edmonton (CMA).
- Toronto has the second largest Ukrainian population of 130,355 (10.4% of the Ukrainian population in Canada), which increased by 6.4% and represents 2.3% of the population of Toronto (CMA). Toronto has the second largest Ukrainian population of 122,510, which increased by 17.2% and represents only 2.40% of Toronto (CMA).
- Winnipeg has the third largest Ukrainian population of 115,230 (9.2% of the Ukrainian population in Canada), which increased by 4.4% and represents 15.8% of Winnipeg (CMA).
- Ukrainians make up over 10% of the population of these cities – Saskatoon (16.1%), Winnipeg (15.8%), Thunder Bay (13.4%) Regina (13.4%) and Edmonton (12.8%). [see page 13]
- The following cities have seen their Ukrainian populations grow by over 20% since the last census – Moncton, New Brunswick (73.8%), North Battleford, Saskatchewan (29.8%), Nanaimo, British Columbia (26.2%), Woodstock, Ontario (23.3%), and Powell River, British Columbia (22.3%). [see page 11]

Provincial Statistics

The Ukrainian Ethnic population in Canada grew faster than the Canadian population grew in the census period 2001-1996 (4.3% compared to 4.0%) and 2006-2001 (12.9% compared to 5.4%). However, in 2011-2006 census period, the Ukrainian ethnic population grew at a slower rate (3.5% compared 5.9%)

Based on the 2006 census, Ukrainian ethnic population represented 3.82% of the total Canadian population, this decreased to 3.74% in 2011.

Alberta has seen its Ukrainian ethnic population grow on average over 10% per census period in the last three census periods, which has resulted the Ukrainian ethnic population in Alberta growing from 258,920 in 1996 to 345,410 in 2011 and now has the **largest Ukrainian ethnic population**, representing 27.6% of the Ukrainians in Canada.

Ukrainian Credit Unions and their respective Ethnic Ukrainian populations based on the 2011 Census

- There are now six (6) Ukrainian credit unions left in Canada compared to ten (10) Ukrainian credit unions in 2006 when the last census was completed. The number of credit unions have declined due to mergers with the two largest credit unions.
- The total membership of the six credit unions in 2011 was 68,390 compared to 69,984 for the ten credit unions in 2006, a decrease of 1,594 members. The decrease in membership can somewhat explained by the Ukrainians who had accounts in more than one of credit unions. Their account were consolidated as a result of the mergers which occurred over the last 5 years.
- The total assets in 2011 amounted to \$1.715 billion or \$25,077 per member compared to \$1.245 billion in 2006 or \$17,787 per member, an average asset growth rate of 6.6% per year.
- The two Manitoba credit union's memberships represented approximately 9.0% of the Ukrainian population in Manitoba. Carpathia Credit Union's members represent about 10.8% of the Winnipeg Ethnic Ukrainian population.
- The two largest Ukrainian credit union's memberships represent approximately 10% of the Ethnic Ukrainian populations in the cities where they have branches. Together, their memberships represented approximately 13.6% of the Ethnic Ukrainian population in Ontario.
- The Montreal Caisse Populaire's membership represents approximately 14.6% of the Ukrainian population in the Montreal CMA area.
- New Community Credit Union located in Saskatoon total membership represents only 5.4% of the Ethnic Ukrainian population in Saskatoon.
- Total membership of the Ukrainian credit unions in Canada of 68,390 represents only 5.5% of the Ethnic Ukrainian population in Canada.
- Taking into consideration only those cities which Ukrainian credit unions have branches, the total membership represents about 14.7% of the Ethnic Ukrainian population.

Based on Statistics Canada Census of Urban Centres - Mother Tongue.**2006 Census – Ukrainian mother tongue vs Ukrainian ethnic population**

- Based on the **2006 census** the Ukrainian mother tongue population represented only 11.1% of the Ukrainian population – 134,495 Ukrainians said that their mother tongue was Ukrainian out of 1,209,090 who said that they were Ukrainian.
- Based on the 2006 census - Montreal based mother tongue Ukrainians represented 22.6% of the Ukrainian living in Montreal – the largest percentage.
- Based on the 2006 census - Toronto based mother tongue Ukrainians represented 20.3% of the Ukrainian living in Toronto.
- Quebec and Ontario mother tongue Ukrainians represented 16.9% and 14.4% of the Ukrainian ethnic population in those provinces.

2011 Census – Ukrainian mother tongue

- The number of Ukrainians surveyed in **2011 census** by Statistics Canada who advised that Ukrainian is their mother tongue has decreased by 17.1% to 111,530 from 134,495, and represents 8.9% of the 1,251,170 Ethnic Ukrainian population in Canada.
- Toronto continues to have the largest Ukrainian mother tongue population of 25,540, which decreased by only 6.4% and represents 22.9% of the Ukrainians in Canada (based on mother tongue). This smaller decline is probably due to the large influx of Ukrainian speaking immigrants from Ukraine which have chosen Toronto as their home.
- Edmonton has the second largest Ukrainian mother tongue population of 13,465, which decreased by 16.6% and represents 12.1% of the Ukrainians in Canada (based on mother tongue).
- Winnipeg has the third largest Ukrainian mother tongue population of 10,400, which decreased by 19.5% and represents 9.3% of the Ukrainians in Canada (based on mother tongue).
- Ukrainians have become more urban over the last 5 years with almost 70% of mother tongue Ukrainians living in major urban centres.
- There has been a slower decline in the number of mother tongue Ukrainians in the urban centres – declined by 16.3% compared to 18.7% in the smaller centres and rural Canada.
- There are more female Ukrainian mother tongue Canadians (61,940) than male Ukrainian mother Canadians (49,495) and the females represent 55.6% of the Ukrainian mother tongue population in Canada.

Ukrainian Credit Unions and their respective mother tongue populations

- When only considering the Ukrainian mother tongue population statistics, Ukrainian credit union (membership) penetration of Ukrainian population speaking Ukrainian looks very good. However, the Ukrainian credit unions have accepted members from mixed marriages and local individuals (not Ukrainians or Ukrainian speaking) to their membership. So these penetration numbers are somewhat misleading.
- The three credit unions in Ontario's total membership represented 112.0% of the mother tongue Ukrainians in Ontario.
- The two Ukrainian Credit Unions in Winnipeg (Carpathia & North Winnipeg) total membership represented 91.3% of the Ukrainians in Manitoba.
